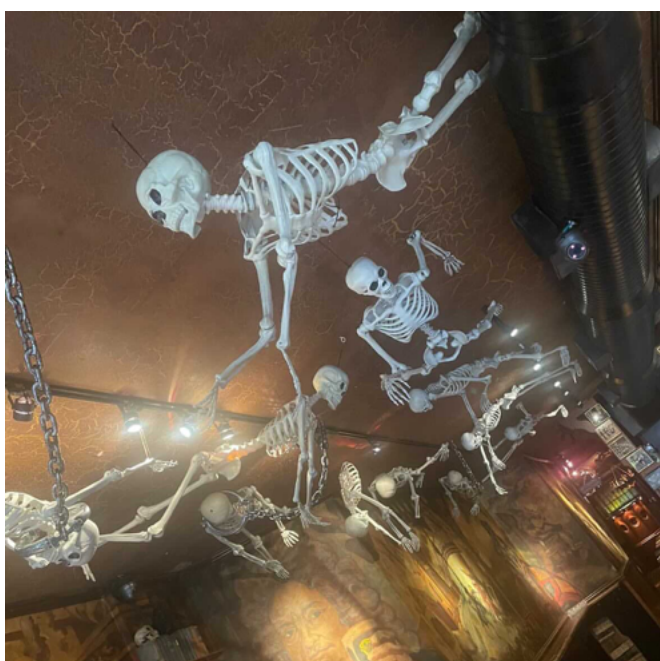


Pick Up Pounds of Sour Patch Kids at Their Flagship Store

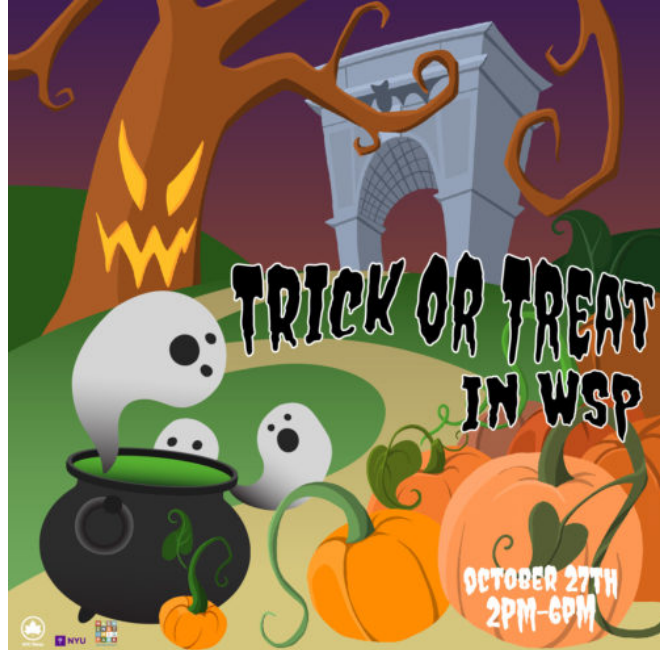
A Showfields Halloween
