DSNY: For Residents

The Department of Sanitation sets out a range of rules for NYC residents to encourage smooth, city-wide functioning and promote the quality of life in neighborhoods. Policies range from recycling setout to snow and ice removal, and failing to meet them often result in fines. The following guide is meant to help residents navigate the guidelines put out by DSNY across matters from trash collection to maintenance of sidewalks to recycling protocols.

Trash and Recycling: Collection and Setout Laws

- If you are a resident that receives private carter collection, make sure to separate construction waste.
- If you receive DSNY collection service, follow this link to find out the trash, recycling, and compost collection days for your address: <u>https://www1.nyc.gov/assets/dsny/site/home</u>
- All trash and recycling should be placed curbside in front of your building between 4PM and midnight the night before your regular scheduled collection day. Residential trash should never be placed in public or NoHo BID baskets.
- There is no collection on sanitation holidays, which generally coincide with federal holidays. If a holiday occurs on your trash collection day, put your items out after 4PM that day for collection beginning the next day. For recycling collection days, put your items out after 4PM the day before your next scheduled recycling collection day.

Compost

Avoid Violations!

- Pick up after your pet, and make sure your dog is on a leash no more than six feet long. Violators will be fined \$250.
- Fully encase mattresses and box springs within a sealed plastic bag when placed out for collection to avoid a fine of \$100.
- All NYC residents are required to recycle metal, glass, plastic, beverage cartons, paper, and cardboard.

Proper Snow and Ice Removal

- After a winter storm, remove snow and ice to create a path that's at least 4 feet wide in front of your property.
- This must be done within 4 hours if the snow stops falling before 5pm, and within 14 hours if it stops falling in the evening.
