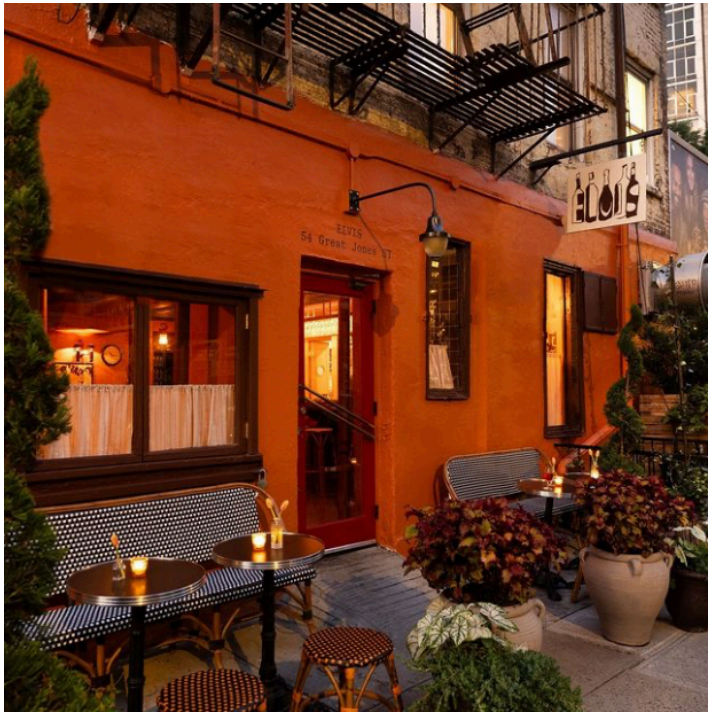
Welcome to the Neighborhood, Inkerman

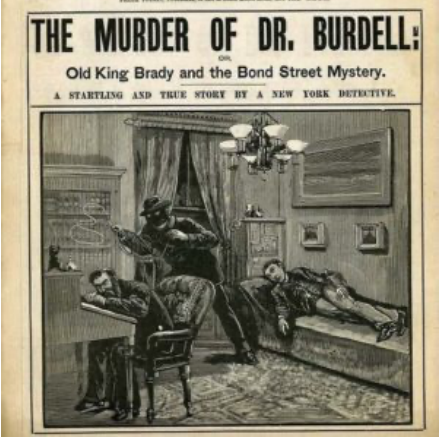
